One day we'll visit an open-air market, nibbling cheeses, sampling olives and stopping to chat with friendly vendors. On another day we'll stand in a magnificent amphitheater built by the Romans more than 2,000 years ago. During the course of our week we'll taste wine in celebrated wineries, sample the region's acclaimed fare, visit the food halls with a chef and help him prepare lunch, even go truffle hunting with a local expert. When we return to our villa in the afternoon, we'll find the bar open and the chef busy preparing a superb dinner.

The following week, we'll board one of Europe's finest riverboats to cruise up the Rhone River from the Mediterranean through the heart of France. Each day we'll awaken to new sights and new experiences. This is great travel without tedious bus rides, without packing up each morning and without worries. Some of the sights include the great Roman city of Arles, with its huge 2,000 year old amphitheater, the fabled Rhone and Beaujolais wine regions and the great (but off-the-tourists' path) city of Lyon. Thursday, October 4, 2012 ♦ Arrive in Marseille, France

We'll meet your arriving flight in Marseille today and, early in the afternoon, drive into the countryside to our lovely villa, *Le Mas de la Rose*. Welcoming us with a glass of champagne upon arrival will be the villa's charming owner, Fabienne Huppert. It will feel great to relax in our elegant bedrooms for a few hours before we gather this evening for cocktails and dinner.

Friday, October 5, 2012 ♦ The hillside villages of the Luberon

If you have not read the delightful book, *A Year in Provence*, by British author Peter Mayle, you'll want to do so before we head out this morning to 2 or 3 of the most delightful villages anywhere in France, Gordes, Roussillon and Menerbes. We won't need guided tours here; rather, we'll simply walk along the charming old streets, greet the local merchants and, perhaps, envy the way of life in these little villages that overflow with charm.

Gordes is known for its dominant position high atop the hills as well as for an unusual ancient village of mysterious, pyramid-shaped dwellings (bories) centered around a communal bread oven. (A hint of scandal: It was Gordes where the Marquis de Sade came when he suddenly felt the necessity to flee Paris. His chateau is now owned by designer Pierre Cardin.)

Saturday, October 6, 2012 ♦ The Mediterranean – Cassis, Bouillabaisse and the Calenques

This morning we visit Cassis, a picturesque fishing harbor on the Mediterranean where the catch still arrives fresh each morning. We'll stop for lunch at a portside restaurant known for the region's iconic fare: bouillabaisse. This legendary broth is served with a selection of fish, croutons, boiled potatoes, parmesan cheese and a special garlicky sauce called a 'rouille'. The perfect wine for our bouillabaisse is a Rosé Côte de Provence. Bon Appetit!

After lunch we'll cruise through the turquoise-colored coves of the Calenques on board a private boat. A marvelous Saturday afternoon.

Sunday, October 7, 2012 ♦ L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue and Chateauneuf-du-Pape

The “Island in the River Sorgue “ is a charming little town nearly surrounded by the waters of the river. Due to the many water wheels that could be built on the river, L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue was once a bustling manufacturing town known for weaving, dyeing, tanning, paper making and milling of grain.

Today we'll visit the famous Sunday market in L'isle-sur-la-Sorgue. In addition to all the fresh produce, flowers, and fabrics, this market is known for its antiques. Bring your camera and your shopping bag; it's great fun. Women bargain loudly with the merchants; the clamor of chickens, ducks and geese add to the noise, and the colorful fruits and vegetables provide wonderful compositions for photographers. In addition to tempting cheeses, patés, sausages, olives and garden-fresh produce, merchants display brightly printed Provencal tablecloths, rustic dishware, pungent spices and intriguing articles for the kitchen and home. It's a great morning!

This afternoon we visit the village and the vineyards of Chateauneuf-du-Pape. During the 100+ years the popes lived in Avignon, the viticulture flourished here – the local poet said at the time that it was far easier to find good wine than holy water in Avignon. While here, we've arranged a private visit to a chateau and its wine cellar for a tasting.

Monday, October 8, 2012 ♦ Aix-en-Provence

Our destination today is the region's old capital, the lovely city of Aix-en-Provence. Today the graceful mansions, grand squares and exuberant fountains from the 17th and 18th Centuries bestow great charm on Aix. It's no wonder that the historical center has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

We take the time to explore "Old Aix" with its maze of pedestrian streets lined with boutiques and markets. The great painter, Paul Cezanne, was born in Aix-en-Provence. While enrolled to study law at the city's university, he spent much of his time painting and writing poetry. (Reminds us of our kids.)

Highlights of our visit to Aix include the famed farmers market on Place Richelme and the warren of little streets in the city's old center.

This could be a good time for some shopping and exploring before we return to Le Mas de la Rose. On the way home we'll visit Chocolaterie Puyricard for a tasting of calissons, the delicious petal-shaped marzipan candies closely identified with Aix-en-Provence.

Tuesday, October 9, 2012 ♦ Food, Cooking and Truffles

This morning we'll visit nearby Avignon, where, in the 14th Century, the city welcomed a succession of nine popes when the politics in Rome made it uncomfortable for the papacy.

This morning we'll follow a local chef on an exploration of Avignon's amazing food halls. He'll introduce us to local producers and explain the dazzling array of colors and aromas surrounding us: sweet melons from Cavaillon, freshly-pressed olive oils, strawberries from Carpentras, grapes from Muscat de Ventoux, candied fruits from Apt plus truffles, tapenade and herbes de Provence. What a treat!

After our chef selects the ingredients for lunch, we'll have the opportunity to watch or assist him as he prepares our meal. It should be fun.

This afternoon we've arranged an exceptional experience. Following a truffle master and his expert dog, we'll hunt for truffles (known in France as the diamonds of the kitchen) in the forests of Venasque. Following the hunt, we'll taste the local speciality, "la brouillade", made with truffles. Don't forget your camera!

Wednesday, October 10, 2012 ♦ On the Trail of Vincent Van Gogh

The unparalleled brilliance of the natural light in Provence attracted many of the *impressionistes*. We'll begin our day in nearby St.-Remy-de-Provence, where Van Gogh continued to paint while he was confined to an asylum near the end of his life. We'll view the same grove of olive trees he saw and painted from his little window.

St. Remy is a delightful little community, often a discreet home to the world's celebrities. You'll find wonderful shopping and delightful places to sit outside for a *café au lait* or a glass of wine. While here we'll visit a master chocolatier renowned for his selection of spiced chocolates.

We've left the afternoon free so that you have a few moments to organize your belongings before we depart tomorrow for Arles to board our riverboat. Meanwhile our chef at Le Mas de la Rose is hard at work preparing our farewell dinner. We hate to leave.

Thursday, October 11, 2012 ♦ Arles and the Amadagio

Mid-morning we bid farewell to Fabienne Huppert and her team that have taken such good care of us. We'll travel through the Alpille Mountains, stopping to visit an olive mill that produces an appellation quality (Vallee de Baux) olive oil. Early this afternoon we'll board our handsome riverboat, the Amadagio, berthed in Arles.

You'll soon settle into your comfortable, well-equipped staterooms, each offering good closet space, a private bath, even a flat screen television with complimentary movies and Internet.

Tonight we'll gather for a drink before proceeding to the dining room for our Welcome Aboard dinner.

If you haven't cruised Europe's rivers before, you have missed a great experience. Unlike an ocean going vessel, you usually cruise within several yards of the shoreline, providing you with great views of the landscapes. Often you are close enough to the shore to call a friendly greeting. Want to head off on your own? Borrow one of the ship's well-maintained bicycles and helmets for a ride through the countryside.

On most days the ship cruises at night, so you make the most of your waking hours. Excursions are complimentary (using those great ear-bud speakers that allow everyone to hear well) and are organized for active walkers, normal walkers and for those with limited walking capabilities.

The dining room offers a rich bounty of cuisine complimented by free flowing local wines and beer during the dinner hours. Coffees and snacks are complimentary around the clock.

We would be remiss if we didn't mention the on-board entertainment. On many evenings well-regarded local entertainers come on board to perform in the ship's elegant lounge. Come early because these events fill the grand lounge.

Friday, October 12, 2012 ♦ Arles and Les Baux de Provence

Our excursion this morning takes us to Les Baux, a striking hilltop fortified village. During the French religious wars, Les Baux was a prominent stronghold for Protestants until it was destroyed by Louis XIII. It's filled with charm (and boutiques) today.

This afternoon we'll visit Arles. When Julius Caesar defeated Marseille in 49 BC,

Arles became Caesar's Roman capital in southern France. In typical Roman fashion, the city was laid out in a grid-like pattern with its main streets following the north-south and east-west axes. A massive aqueduct brought fresh water from the mountains and the Romans' built a magnificent amphitheater and dramatic theater that survive to this day.

More recently Arles gained prominence as the city that hosted Vincent Van Gogh when he left Paris. It was here where he regained his health and enjoyed visits by his onetime friend, Paul Gauguin. Arles and the surrounding countryside inspired Van Gogh to paint non-stop: workers in the fields, portraits, views of Arles – all in all, he completed more than 200 paintings during his short time here. As we explore the lovely city, you'll recognize a few sights today that were immortalized in his works.

Saturday, October 13, 2012 ♦ Avignon and Viviers

Though we visited Avignon briefly during our stay at our villa, today we'll see more of the sights of Avignon including the great fortified palace built for the seven popes who made their home here. Avignon is a wonderful walking city with marvelous architecture, fortified ramparts and vibrant street life -- no wonder that UNESCO declared it a World Heritage Site.

As an alternative excursion, you may wish to visit Pont du Gard, a massive three-level aqueduct built by the Romans in the 1st Century to span a pretty valley and carry water some 30 miles from the mountains to the Roman city of Nimes. It, too, has been declared a World Heritage Site. This excursion includes a visit to the medieval village of Uzès, known for its picturesque town square, and ducal castle.

When we arrive in Viviers this evening, we'll want to join in on a "ghost walk", led by the local residents, through the city's old historical center.

Sunday, October 14, 2012 ♦ Viviers and Tournon



After breakfast this morning, we're invited to join the ship's excursion to Grignan, a magnificent village perched upon a hill surrounded by lavender fields. From Grignan's castle, the views of the countryside are memorable.

This afternoon, our handsome riverboat continues its journey upriver towards Tournon; it's an ideal time to relax, perhaps in a lounge chair on the Sun Deck to watch the lovely scenery pass by.

Tuesday, October 16, 2012 ♦ Tournon and Vienne

Though Tournon is proud of its 15th Century chateau, we stop here because we're in the center of the marvelous Cote-du-Rhone wine region. Following French tradition that wine is good at any time of day, we'll make an excursion this morning to one of the best wineries for a tour and a tasting. Later, during our free time, you may wish to visit Tournon's historic castle which now serves as the City Hall.

When we reach the the old Roman and medieval city of Vienne this evening, Christine and Paul invite you ashore for dinner in a cozy bistro.

Tuesday, October 16, 2012 ♦ Vienne and Trevoux

"Perched like an altar on a bend in the Rhone River, Vienne is a town of exceptional interest". The Romans brought their amazing culture here 2,000 years ago and, during the Middle Ages, the bishops of Vienne ruled over a vast territory.

Traveling by mini-train this morning, we'll visit 1st century Roman temples and the well-preserved Roman theater, both situated near the city's handsome cathedrals. After lunch the Amadagio sails up river towards Lyon. As we sail through the heart of Lyon (don't miss it!), our ship leaves the Rhone River to continue its voyage upstream on the Saone River to Trevoux, the former capital of an ancient principality.

When we arrive late this afternoon, we'll take a walking tour through the historic village to see Trevoux's old parliament, medieval ramparts and hillside chateaux. Our stop here provides us with an opportunity to play the popular French game of petanque; it's easy to learn but can be devilishly difficult to master.

Wednesday, October 17, 2012 ♦ Trevoux and Lyon

This morning our excursion brings us through the "Pays d'Or" (land of the golden stones), home to the famed Beaujolais wine region. We'll visit the medieval hillside village of Oingt as well as the winery and home of a local vintner. Of course we'll taste a drop or two of wine.

After lunch on board the Amadagio we'll sail downstream to return to Lyon. When we arrive, an excursion shows us the highlights of this splendid city. Don't miss the Captain's farewell dinner this evening, a fine conclusion to our memorable fortnight in the heart of France.
