June 15, 2012 • Depart North America for Rotterdam, The Netherlands

This morning we embark upon a superb journey into the heart of Scandinavia and the Baltic. Delightful adventures and friendly people await our visit; for now, however, settle back in the seat of your aircraft as you fly high above the Atlantic and reflect on the many pleasures that lie ahead. Note: If you fly from many US cities including Portland, we suggest one of Delta Airline's convenient non-stop flights to Amsterdam.

June 16, 2012 • Arrive in Rotterdam, The Netherlands

This morning your flight lands in Amsterdam, one of Europe's most interesting cities. You'll be met personally at Amsterdam's airport and brought directly to our ship berthed about an hour away in Rotterdam.

Just a few blocks away from Holland America's original headquarters in Rotterdam, we'll board, appropriately, the ms Rotterdam to begin our cruise to the Baltic. There's always a buzz of excitement in the air when a great ship prepares for a special voyage.

Note: We suggest you come to Rotterdam two days early to visit Holland's once-a-decade Floriade, the world's largest floral exhibition. See more information on our optional Floriade program on page 16.

June 17, 2012 • Cruising the North Sea



After your trans-Atlantic flights, you'll welcome a relaxing day at sea. Since our lovely ship offers so much, we suggest you explore it thoroughly. To orient yourself, you may wish to take a deck plan and head to the top deck. From there work your way down – you'll be amazed at all the handsome public areas as well as all the facilities and activities offered by the ship's helpful staff.

This evening the captain welcomes us to his embarkation dinner.

June 18, 2012 • Explore Copenhagen, Denmark

Most travelers rate Copenhagen as one of their favorite cities in Europe. Copenhagen is home to lively Tivoli Gardens, (one of Europe's best entertainment parks for both children and adults), miles of pedestrian-only streets, a handsome Royal Palace, charming historic docklands area and friendly English-speaking Danes.



We recommend a visit to Tivoli Gardens as well as a leisurely stroll along the main pedestrian streets.



Don't miss the design store, Illums Bolighus, that enjoys a worldwide reputation for its display of the world's contemporary design. Also, for an interesting overview of the city, we suggest a canal cruise through the neighborhoods.

If you have seen Copenhagen before and wish to branch out, we recommend a tour of Denmark's great "Castle Country" in nearby North Zealand.

June 19, 2012 • Kiel, Germany

Though Kiel is an attractive university city and sailing center in north Germany, you may wish to use this opportunity to visit nearby Hamburg, a beautiful city and important North Sea port (Europe's third largest).

Badly destroyed during World War II, Hamburg has been rebuilt to its former glory. Those interested in marine trade will want to visit the harbor with its Maritime and Spice Museums. Shoppers: don't miss window shopping on the chic Jungfernstieg. Nearby you'll find two beautiful lakes and parks within the city, the Binnen- and Ausser-Alster.



June 20, 2012 • Warnemünde, Germany

Don't forget your camera when you walk through Warnemünde, once a sleepy fishing village in East Germany. Now one of north Germany's premier resorts, you'll find fine dining and good shopping in the quaint buildings lining the narrow harbor. (The G8 Summit of world leaders took place just a few miles away in the summer of 2007.)

Many travelers use Warnemünde as a gateway to visit Berlin, Germany's dynamic new capital, where some of the world's finest architects have collaborated to rebuild this important city. If you haven't seen Berlin recently or expect to return in the future, we recommend this excursion.

June 21, 2012 • Cruising the Baltic Sea



During our free time today, you may wish to take a cooking class in the ship's Culinary Arts Center, watch a recent release film, work out in the fitness center or relax with a soothing treatment from the ship's spa. Or you could curl up in a comfy deck chair with a good book as the ship cruises across the sea. This is the life.

June 22, 2012 • Tallinn, Estonia

This morning we'll sail into a delightful city that will surprise you with the beauty of its old medieval town center. Thanks to its history as an important trading center of the Hanseatic League, Tallinn boasts a superb collection of fine architecture. Built on a hill laced with winding cobblestone streets, the old city has carefully been maintained, even during the country's difficult years under the Soviets (1939-1991). It's interesting to watch this country grow and prosper since it gained its independence from Russia – it's one of Europe's success stories. Shoppers: look for bargains in well-crafted amber jewelry.



June 23-24, 2012 • St. Petersburg, Russia - Optional VIP Excursion



To bring his country closer to Western Europe, Peter the Great commissioned some of Europe's finest architects to construct an extravagant new capital to be located at the eastern edge of the Baltic Sea, St. Petersburg. Though the city suffered greatly during

the wars and revolutions of the 20th Century, many of the magnificent structures have been restored to their original glory: the Tsar's Winter Palace (now the world-renowned Hermitage Museum), the handsome Italianate palaces built along the Neva River canals, St. Isaac's Cathedral, and Smolny Convent, to mention just a few of the many special sights.

The Tsars and their friends also built extraordinary summer palaces in the countryside surrounding St. Petersburg. Do-not-miss sights include Catherine's elaborate palace at Pushkin or Peterhof, the dramatic summer palace of Peter the Great.

During our two-day stay in St. Petersburg, you may also have the opportunity to see a ballet or opera in the world-renowned Mariinsky Theater (once called the Kirov) or a performance by the famed Russian circus. You'll be happy you came for a visit.



Cruise Masters has worked with our influential local agent in St. Petersburg to offer an (optional) two-day private excursion to provide you with a more in-depth view of this extraordinary country than you would normally receive from the ship's excursions. This is always a popular excursion.

With their superb connections in St. Petersburg, our on-site agent can arrange VIP admissions for us so that we can often enter the Hermitage and other palaces before the general public arrives to flood the halls.



June 25, 2012 • Helsinki, Finland



Early in the 19th Century, the Tsar of Russia acquired Finland from Sweden. In order to reduce Swedish influence in the country, he moved Finland's capital closer to Russia, to a village called Helsinki. He commissioned his architects to design a completely new city center in a neoclassical style.

In the 20th Century, Finland's daring artists and architects helped define contemporary design. As you look around the city this morning, you can't help but notice fine architecture with influences from Russia to the East and Europe to the West.

June 26, 2012 • Stockholm, Sweden

When visitors come to Stockholm in the summer-time, they often wonder why they haven't heard more about this beautiful city. We'll begin our day with an overview of Stockholm and its stunning harbor. Next, we'll walk through the narrow streets and winding lanes of Gamla Stan, the postcard-perfect medieval quarter where the city began. We'll also stop by Stockholm's City Hall to see the splendid halls where the Nobel Prize winners celebrate their awards each December.



We'll conclude our morning in Skansen, a fascinating outdoor collection of homes, farms and public buildings brought to Stockholm from every corner of Sweden. English speaking staff, outfitted in attire appropriate to the era, bring these restored buildings to life.

Finally, we've planned a special lunch and afternoon that will set our day apart from all the others – you'll feel very special. You'll be pleased that the Rotterdam spends the evening in Stockholm – you may wish to take a walk in the gentle glow of Sweden's long twilight.

June 27, 2012 • Stockholm and Sweden's Archipelago

The morning is yours to enjoy as you please. If you wish to shop for friends (or yourself) Swedish crystal is available at prices considerably lower than we find at home. Or you might want to visit the Wasa Museum, home to the famed Swedish 'man-o-war' recovered in remarkable condition a couple of decades ago after a few hundred years resting on the bottom of Stockholm's harbor.

When we sail through Sweden's famed archipelago this afternoon, we suggest a good place on deck (or on your private balcony) to watch as we pass hundreds of forested islands dotted with summer homes and vacationing Swedes. At certain points we come so close to shore we can almost smell the salmon sizzling on the barbecue. It takes nearly three hours of constant maneuvering before the captain can sail the open seas – a great afternoon of cruising.

June 28-29, 2012 • Cruising the Baltic Sea

Our journey takes us across the Baltic and around the Danish peninsula into the North Sea. During these days at sea, if you enjoy superb dining, please accept our invitation to dine with our compliments in the ship's superb Pinnacle Grill. Steak lovers will treasure their prime cuts of Midwestern beef seared on a fiery grill exactly to your taste. You'll also find superb appetizers (don't miss the crab cakes), salads, fine seafood and decadent desserts – it's quite an occasion.

June 30, 2012 Depart Holland for Norway

This afternoon the Rotterdam heads north once again, this time bound for Norway's deep, clear waters. A great week lies ahead.

July 1, 2012 At Sea

As we cruise north, it's a perfect day for relaxation (perhaps a little pampering) before we begin our cruise into Norway's fjords.

July 2, 2012 Bergen, Norway Signature Journey Excursion today



SIGNATURE JOURNEY PRIVATE EXCURSION



We begin with one of Norway's jewels, the charming city of Bergen. One of its treasures is the *Bryggen* district of historic wooden buildings. This is where the young traders of the Hanseatic League once lived and worked. Don't forget your camera.



Nearby you'll find a delightful market filled with freshly-caught fish, smoked fish and other summer delights. If the weather is clear, don't miss a ride up the mountainside on the Bergen funicular for stunning views.

Finally, you'll want to visit the nearby countryside home of Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg. It's situated in a pretty spot along the fjords. Not only will you see how the Norwegians lived during this era, when you hear Grieg's music you'll find yourself thinking back to his little cottage where he composed with monumental works.

July 3, 2012 Cruising the Geirangerfjord, Norway

Thanks to these narrow inlets from the sea, today you'll cruise several hours right into Norway's interior on the beautiful Geiranger Fjord. You'll be surprised that such a large vessel could sail between towering snowcapped mountains into this 10-mile long body of water.



At the end of the fjord, we reach Geiranger. Nestled under mountains towering 6,000 feet above the town, the town has retained its

charming village atmosphere. Hikers and walkers may enjoy spending time on the community's well-marked trails. Don't forget your camera.

July 4, 2012 Ålesund, Norway

To celebrate America's Independence Day, we'll visit Ålesund, a charming community of about 40,000 people. The town is built right into the Atlantic Ocean at the center of a group of islands. Over the years the town has spread onto five additional islands now linked by bridges. Not surprisingly the origins of Ålesund dates back to the Stone Age, when fishermen came here for abundance of fish in the surrounding seas.



In 1904 the town was completely destroyed by fire during a raging storm, leaving 10,000 inhabitants homeless. With help from several countries, the town was rebuilt in the style of the day, Art Nouveau. Today this community is renowned for the wonderful quality of its architecture.

July 5, 2012 Cruising the Hardangerfjord, Eidfjord, Norway

This stunning seaway reaches more than 100 miles into the heart of Norway. With gently sloping orchard-covered hills near the coast, the Hardangerfjord gradually penetrates deep into mountainous areas. We'll go ashore today in the picturesque resort community of Eidfjord. While there don't miss the stunning 606 ft high waterfall known as Vøringfossen, located about 10 miles away.



July 6, 2012 At Sea sailing towards The Netherlands

It's been quite a voyage. First Scandinavia's lovely capitals and now the rugged wilderness surrounding Norway's Fjords. We'll return home with our minds full of wonderful memories and our camera's overflowing with wonderful photos. Before you begin to organize your belongings for departure tomorrow, take a few moments to savor all the memories.

July 7, 2012 Rotterdam, Depart for home.

When you arrive this morning, we'll organize your transfer to Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport for your flight high across the Atlantic towards home.
